A Pirate Invitation!

- ✚ You can use cheap parchment paper for your master copy. With the master copy, you will be able to photocopy as many invitations as you need.
- ✚ For a more authentic look, try using paper that looks like old parchment. You should be able to find this at any photocopy store or office supply establishment.
- ✚ Try using artistic fonts to give your invitations an authentic look. There are several available, including Matura MT Script, Informal Roman, and Lucida Calligraphy. .
- ✚ You can enhance your invitations by placing pirate cartoons at header and footer of your invitations.
- ✚ You can also try burning the edges of the paper to make it appear old and weathered.
- ✚ Rolling up the invitations like a scroll will enhance their look. You can use cheap ribbons or strings to secure the scroll.
- ✚ For the final touch, try placing them in old bottles. (Wine bottles would be preferable).

By using these tips, you guests will feel that they are about to embark on a great adventure! Now that you have your invitations ready, it is time to start thinking about the party's atmosphere.

The ambience of a Pirate Party

What are the things that distinguish a Pirate Party? Old ships, buried treasure, and tattered clothes. Make your pirate party a perfect event by creating the same atmosphere. Getting all the things you'll need is not an issue if you have deep pockets, but there are other ways you can design an event that will not break your budget. In this section, we'll discuss some great ideas that will save you money. Here are some innovative ways you can create an authentic environment by using some resourceful ideas.

- ✚ Shopping at costume shops after Halloween is one way to save. It's best to shop for items a day or two after the holiday. Some stores specialize in costumes and you can find great deals if you shop out of season.

- ✚ Make full use of netting and ropes. You can arrange these to make your guests feel as if they were on an old pirate ship. In this regard, rope ladders would be ideal. By using shiny ribbons, you can manipulate the lighting and give your party a great visual effect.
- ✚ Use perfume or room freshener with an exotic fragrance that will get your guests attention. There are fresheners made purely out of oranges. This will give your room a fresh and tropical scent.
- ✚ If you live in an area with an abundance of palm trees, try using fallen palm tree fronds to enhance the look of your party. It will give your place the look of a deserted island. If you can't procure any authentic palms, try using cutouts to match the look. Olive green paper is probably the best color choice for this. By folding the paper, you can create a lot of fronds in a short amount of time.
- ✚ You can also construct a dungeon cell somewhere in the corner of your main room. Better yet, you can use white or black streamers to create the effect. All you will need to do is run the streamers vertically from the top of a doorway. This will give the room the appearance of a prison and add to the overall effect.
- ✚ Set up a big buffet at the center of your table. Use streamers and let them droop from the ceiling and wall behind the buffet table. This will create a festive look. If possible, try placing an old unlit chandelier over the buffet table. For something more practical, try placing an old candle stand on the table. These are easy enough to find and it shouldn't cost a lot. You can find really good deals at large stores like Ikea.
- ✚ Undoubtedly, fog at a pirate party creates an excellent visual effect, especially at the entrance. You can procure a fog machine from your local stage company or party store at a reasonable price. You can also use dry ice to achieve the same effect for significantly less money. Simply place dry ice in a cooler or pan, and use a low power fan to spread the fog. The dry ice could also serve to cool your beverages!
- ✚ You can use sand to enhance the ambience as well. If you live near the coast, this shouldn't be a problem. If you don't live near a beach, you can always buy cheap bags of sand at a hardware store like Home Depot. Just sprinkle the sand at strategic locations. This would work best if you piled sand at the entrance and the bottom of the buffet table. Additionally, you can use seashells to give an authentic appearance. Once again, if you don't live near the sea, you can find shells at art shops like Michaels. You can also hang fishnets in the corners of the room. Try using toy sea creatures to enhance this prop even further.
- ✚ You can name the location of your party with a well-known pirate port (the Barbary Coast for instance) or create your own. Naming your party location will give your party a certain "pirate" credibility.
- ✚ What is one thing that is always associated with pirates? The Jolly Roger flag. These can be found at various outlets or online. All you'll have to do is post the flag right at the front of the entrance. Your guests will feel like they're about to enter Davey Jones's locker!
- ✚ If all or part of your party will take place outdoors, try using tiki torches to improve the look. These are very cheap and can be found at any garden center or hardware store. They can be placed along walkways, patios, pools or gardens to impart a wonderful tropical ambience. Torches at your entrance would look superb even if the party is set up indoors.
- ✚ You can also use a fake skull to really catch you guest's attention. Try placing a fake jewel in an eye socket for added effect. You can also use an eye patch on

- your skull. Additionally, you can use a black or red scarf on the top of the skull to make it appear as a pirate skeleton. None of these items are expensive, and you should be able to find them with ease.
- ✚ Wood can improve the look of your party as well. Old, broken or decayed wood scraps can really improve the party's feel. Wood that has been washed ashore by the ocean can be particularly effective in this regard. You can use wood scraps in the yard to resemble a broken ship. You can also make use of wood by writing catchphrases (like S.O.S.). A back diffused light would serve to highlight the wood and create a fantastic effect.
 - ✚ You can use other props, like toy guns and swords to give your party that pirate look. They can be hung on the wall or placed on tables. Toy guns and swords are readily available at any toy or costume store and they shouldn't cost too much.
 - ✚ If the event is held during the evening, illuminate the dusk with different colored bulbs placed outdoors and at the entrance. Ideally, you should use purple, red or dark green lights to give off a mysterious effect.
 - ✚ Try using an old trunk as a centerpiece. A picnic basket could also be used for this effect. You can place speckled bottles, old lanterns, toy swords and a map in and around the trunk for added effect. You can place the trunk wherever you like, but it's best if it's a highlighted item. Shovels placed near or around the chest will also improve the look.
 - ✚ In order to retain the authenticity of your party, try using curtains to conceal modern items. You don't have to use actual curtains to achieve this. It's much cheaper to buy some cloth for this purpose
 - ✚ For entertainment and fun, make WANTED posters of your guests. No doubt, your guests will love this charming prop. You can even use a photoshop editor to make your guests look like real pirates!
 - ✚ It would be great if you were able to show various pirate movies. You don't even have to have the sound up. The visual effect would be good enough and posters from pirate movies could also add to this effect. Considering the recent pirate movies that have been released, this should not be a problem.
 - ✚ Give your party place a cave look. Cover the walls with wrinkled brown or black papers. Place some shrubs and plants at the entrance. Place some digging tools and old lanterns in a hallway at different corners. Make creative use of curtains at hallways and doors to give the guest a narrow view of the room. Your guest's interest will be piqued and they'll be curious to learn of what awaits on the other side.
 - ✚ How about adding some interesting live characters? It will be a great surprise when a drunken pirate joins your guests for a drink. You can either hire an actor or recruit one of your friends to do the job. A "real" pirate will grab your guest's attention and add to the success of the party.
 - ✚ Why not give your party a jungle look? Get some green streamers of different shades and hang them from ceiling and walls. It really looks appealing. In the same way, hanging different shades of blue streamers can give the appearance of waterfall. Try doing this at the entrance. Hanging some plastic vines atop the doorway will give it a natural look. Your guests will love coming through this man-made waterfall. Try it!
 - ✚ To add to this feel, try decorating your party with paper flowers that have an exotic and tropical look to them. This will add to the jungle impression.

- ✚ Use balloons to add to the effect. If possible, try finding balloons with the skull and cross-bones image.
- ✚ Spider webbing can give the impression that you're in a jungle or cave. Webbing is readily available at various shops.
- ✚ You can use a large pole to simulate a ship's mast. Try placing a wide bowl at the top. Fill it with plastic grass to give it the appearance of a crow's nest. You can even wrap the pole with rope to give it a more authentic feel.
- ✚ You can simulate a quicksand pit by digging a wide and shallow pit. Fill the pit with dirt, dry grass, leaves etc. The pit will have a peculiar look that will be topped off with a "Beware of Quicksand" sign.
- ✚ If you have a bowling ball, you can use it as a cannon ball prop. Most people don't have their own bowling ball, but you can pick one up fairly cheaply at a thrift shop.
- ✚ Don't forget to place lit candles around the party area. Try to replace electric lighting with candles or old lanterns wherever possible. It will create a more realistic atmosphere and add to the ambiance greatly.
- ✚ See if you can find items such as shark teeth, coral, sea stars and the like. Use these to decorate the walls and the buffet table.
- ✚ Another prop that would work well is a model ship. Whether it's a ship in a bottle, or just an old model, the effect will be nice. You can find these at thrift stores or antique dealers. It might cost you a few bucks but it can enhance your party experience significantly.
- ✚ Try to get some wooden or rust-colored bowls and utensils for your pirate feast.
- ✚ If you are hosting the party outdoors, you can use some old lamps or lanterns to decorate trees and surrounding shrubs.
- ✚ You can make wonderful use of wooden boxes and crates to simulate a ship's cargo. Moreover, big sacks and pillow cases stuffed with anything would give an excellent effect of cargo if rightly placed next to the wooden cartons or against the wall. Burlap bags would be the ideal choice. You can find chocolate candy, wrapped to look like money at many stores. These can be placed in the bags, crates, or chest to simulate a real treasure.
- ✚ Got bones? Bones are not hard to find at the butcher shop and they can be purchased at a cheap price. Ask for the biggest ones they have. Clean them and let them dry under the sun for a few days. They create a fantastic look when placed near the chest or in the ship's prison!
- ✚ You must have seen the hangman's noose in some pirate movie. It looks awesome hanging from the corner ceiling or on a tree branch. You can use any old rope and you can find directions on making the knot on the internet. This site was particularly helpful: http://www.geocities.com/roo_two/hangmansnoose.html
- ✚ At various locations you can place scary, hand-painted signs that read "Enter at your own risk," "This way to the galley," or "X marks the spot!" This can be particularly effective if placed at the front door. It will definitely pique your guest's interests.

Now that you have the decorations set, it's time to start thinking about sound.

The sounds of the Pirate world:

What would a good Pirate party be without great sound? Play a continuous CD or tape to fill your party with a wonderful background sound throughout the party. However, you

must remember that background music should *remain* in the background. The music should not be overwhelming and should only add to the total effect. There are many sound CD's or cassettes recordings available. They include a wonderful assortment of sounds that include waves, seagulls and storm sounds, and they are guaranteed to give your party a pirate feel. Furthermore, you can find a number of good collections online for a cheap price. If you can't find sound recordings, you can always play film soundtracks. There have been several good pirate movies released including the "Pirates of the Caribbean" trilogy, "Peter Pan", and the like. You can use these to add to the overall effect of your party.

The Pirate's Attire!

The pirate costume is fairly unique. Some pirates can be dressed extravagantly, especially characters like Captain Hook. For the most part, this is not the case. Pirates are almost depicted as disheveled and raggedly dressed. Their clothes are invariably bleached, dull tattered, and dingy. You don't have to buy an expensive costume and you can find all you need at home. You might have some old drab pants and shirts that are not of much use to you now. Why not turn them into a pirate outfit? Anything that you're missing can be purchased cheaply at your local thrift store. The key is not to use anything new or clean. You can stain any shirt or pair of pants with dirt or wine etc. You can also cut up the bottom of your pants to simulate wear and tear. Eye patches, scarves, and hooked earrings all work well as accessories. Don't be afraid to use them all!

Treasure Hunt: Turn your party into an adventure!

A pirate party just wouldn't be the same without an exciting treasure hunt. In addition, a treasure hunt isn't possible without a treasure map. In this section, we will discuss how to create an adventurous treasure hunt by making the perfect treasure map!

Making maps by baking them:

- ✚ Your first obvious step will be to copy the images you want onto the paper.
- ✚ Next, preheat your oven and place an old cookie sheet on the top rack.
- ✚ Spray your paper with starch and quickly lay it flat on the hot cookie sheet.
- ✚ The paper will start to curl but it will eventually flatten out.
- ✚ Once you get the desired color, remove the paper from the oven.
- ✚ Be forewarned; this method will make the paper stiff and brittle, but it will also look authentically aged.

Making maps by soaking them in water.

- ✚ Prepare the images and photocopy the amount of maps you'll need.
- ✚ Scrunch up the paper a few times to make it as wrinkled as possible
- ✚ Prepare a dilute solution of brownish water by adding brown food coloring.
- ✚ Dip the paper fully in the colored water.
- ✚ Squeeze the paper and release until the water has worked completely into the paper.
- ✚ Put down the paper flat in the sun to dry
- ✚ After drying, you will get a water-soaked aged and leathery feeling map.

To enhance your map, burn the edges using a small candle. To get the best effect, try many small controlled burns until you reach the desired effect. To create more suspense, write down a clue and then burn off the last few important letters or words. You can also create suspension by burning a small hole somewhere in the middle of the map. To finish off the job, place the maps in treated envelopes and seal them with wax.

The Hunt is on!

- ✚ Make your treasure hunt an exciting activity for all of your guests. Craft an adventurous and daring storyline to drive home the theme of the party. Keep side-plots and clues along the way to help your participants stay in the hunt.
- ✚ You can stage a pirate kidnapping! Have your guests look for a kidnapped pirate somewhere in your house. The guest who frees the pirate will be rewarded with valuable clues as to where to find the treasure.
- ✚ On the guest's invitations, you can print different symbols. These symbols will later be used to divide your guests into teams. The symbols could also serve as clues to the treasure location itself. You can post these symbols at various locations around the party to help direct your guests.
- ✚ For kids, burying a treasure chest in a sandbox would be fun. They will be excited about digging the treasure up once they've solved the map.
- ✚ This is the time to look for all the spare keys in your home. Ask your friends to do the same. Buy a cheap lock with its own key and lock the chest. Place the spare keys at different locations around the party and send your guests out to look for them. Obviously, only one key works, so the vast majority of the guests will be sent on a wild goose chase. Whoever is lucky enough and fast enough to find the key wins!
- ✚ You can use a cake to provide a clue as well. Simply use icing to write the clue on top of the cake. If you have a pet, you can hang a clue from its collar. Those who are smart enough to find the clue will be privy to its secrets!
- ✚ In the case of a children's treasure hunt, you can use photos to help guide them along. Additionally, you can provide them a pirate to work as their guide.
- ✚ You can leave clues inside of cleaned out jars or bottles. Like a "message in a bottle," your guests will be excited to find them.
- ✚ Placing clues near the entrance will be another smart idea. You can also make good use of sound. Simply record a couple of pirates arguing about or discussing the hidden chest. Remember, the voices should not be loud but clear enough to provide the clue.
- ✚ Begin the hunt by giving your participants gold coins. You can readily find chocolates wrapped like gold coins at any supermarket. Your guests can use the coins to barter with various pirates in exchange for clues and even maps. Some pirates may be greedier than others so your guests will have to be wise about their choices.
- ✚ You can also tie clues to balloons filled with helium. You can use the clues to either guide your guests in the right way, or to misdirect them.
- ✚ Use a riddle at the last step of hunt. Your guests will have to answer the question correctly before they can open the chest.

Games for the children!

- ✚ Divide the kids into different teams and ask them to come up with a name for their crew and their ship.

- ✚ Start off with musical chairs. The winner of the game will decide who the captain will be!
- ✚ Similarly, you can have the children play a game of hot potato. You can play the game with a softball. Better yet, paint the ball black so that it will look like a cannon ball. Similar to the game of musical chairs, the child holding the ball when the music stops will be counted out. The winner of the game is rewarded with a clue or a prize.
- ✚ If you have a pool, you can have the children look for treasure in the water. You can use bricks or rocks with coins hidden underneath. Of course, not all of the rocks will reveal treasure. Each child gets to choose just one rock to lift. The lucky one will get the reward.
- ✚ The fishing game can lead to great entertainment for the kids. The pool is the ideal location to play this game, but it can also be played without one. You will need a fishing pole and a hook. Set up various clues or gifts in paper boats and let the children fish them out of the water. If you don't have a pool, you can place items in a treasure chest and have the children collect them with the fishing pole.

- ✚ X marks the spot! For this game, you will need to attach rolled up paper to balloons. On one of the pieces of paper, draw a black X. Set the balloons in the middle of the room with the children around the perimeter. When you say "GO," the children will rush to the balloons, popping as many as they can. The one who finds the X will be the winner.
- ✚ You can use of large boxes or crates to build a network of tunnels. You will need to make two different entrances into the maze. Keep different pirate items like toy parrots, hooks, skulls, model ships, shark teeth etc. inside the tunnels. Divide the children into two crews. When you call out a particular item, one child from each team will enter the maze in a race to find the object. The first one to find the object will be awarded a point for his or her crew. Kids really love to play this game.
- ✚ You can plan a group treasure hunt if the playing area is large enough. Hide chocolate coins in plain view and at appropriate distances. Let the children hunt for them in the same way they would look for Easter eggs. The best part about this game is that each child will be able to find some treasure and they will have loads of fun while playing it.
- ✚ Kids love searching for hidden items. Hide different treasure items, like chocolate coins, candy necklaces, toy jewels and the like in different rooms. Explain to the kids that they have to find as much treasure as possible. Set points for each item and then set a time limit. Once the time is up, tally up the points to declare a winner.

More activities for the children

- ✚ Arrange some string and beads of different colors and types. Have the children make their own necklaces or bracelets. You can find these items at various craft shops for a cheap price, and the children will love making their own jewelry.
- ✚ Provide kids with plain treasure chests and ask them to decorate it with feathers, jewels and paper etc. You can also find small chests at craft stores. If you're having a hard time finding any, you can use small wicker baskets for the same purpose.

- ✚ Hide coins or pennies in the sand and ask the little pirates to find as many pennies as they can within a limited time. The winner will be awarded a prize or a clue.
- ✚ Tell the children a pirate story during any down time or have them watch a pirate movie.
- ✚ More fun with paper boats. If you are having your party at a park, or near moving water, you can set up a pirate ship race. Have your children make their boats, then let them race them in the stream. The winner will receive a prize or clue. Another great website on how to make a paper boat is included below.

- ✚ Don't forget including piñatas in your pirate party. They are great to use because they come in so many shapes, like ships, chests and many other pirate items.
- ✚ You can set up another treasure hunt using a large box and peanut foam. Simply add some chocolate coins to the peanut foam and let the children search for them. Set a time limit for each child. The winner is the one with the most coins.
- ✚ Transform the children into pirates! Have all the children arrive in ordinary outfits. As the party progresses and they participate in various activities, give the children various pirate items. These items may include hooks, hats, temporary tattoos, mustaches, beards, sashes, bandanas, treasure pouches etc. Kids love to get these kind of prizes and the activity will keep their attention throughout the day.
- ✚ Stuff little sacks with candy or interesting pirate items and tie them at various areas with a twine or string. Kids will love to find new treasures or rewards.

Activities for the Adults

Fun activities shouldn't be confined to only the children. How about an adventurous pirate party strictly for the adults? For adults, you will have a much greater range of options. Don't be afraid to create an adventure that will be thrilling, suspenseful, or even scary! Let's see what spine-tingling activities await!

- ✚ Welcome your guests by giving them a temporary tattoo and a pirate scarf or cap.
- ✚ Organize strange costume contests and games. Ask your guests to come in with their best pirate outfits and have a contest to see who looks most like an authentic pirate.
- ✚ Hide a treasure map somewhere deep and out of sight and set aside a big prize for the one who finds it. Your guests will take pleasure in playing this game at their own leisure throughout the party.
- ✚ Set up many poker tables in the party area so your guests can engage in various card games. Let everybody start with a certain amount chips. The guest with the most chips at the end of the evening will be crowned the winner.
- ✚ Put some fake jewels or jelly beans in a crystal clear flask and ask everyone to guess the number of jewels inside. The one who is closest to the number is the winner.
- ✚ Give your guests nametags and instruct them to choose a pirate name like Blackbeard or Captain Hook. Below the name, embellish about your pirates accomplishment like "he possessed 9 ships," or "she was declared the most vindictive pirate," etc. When the party is in full swing, give every guest a paper and pencil and ask them to write the names of all pirates present in the party. Be sure to tell them in advance the total number of guests. Now inform them that one of the pirates is planning a conspiracy. Give different clues based on the

- accomplishments that your guests listed on their nametags. The guest who unmasks the conspirator will be declared the winner. This game will be a lot of fun and keep your guests interested throughout the night.
- ✚ Walk the plank! Blindfold your guests one by one and have them a walk across a long 2 x 4 plank (on the ground of course). The later in the evening you play this game, the funnier it will be, especially if you're serving a bit of that pirate brew! Distribute prizes to the players who are able to walk the plank without falling off.

The Pirates Feast:

- ✚ Try naming different cocktails for your guests. Drinks like "Davey Jones Locker," and "Poseidon's Poison" will be a great hit and your guests will love to have these crazy choices.
- ✚ Use food coloring in your drinks to brighten them up. You can use any color you like but bright red, blue and green are preferable.
- ✚ You can use ice as another creative item. Try serving your guests drinks with colored or flavored ice cubes. They look really great and should be a surprise to your guests.
- ✚ For another ice cube trick, try making ice with toy spiders or insects inside. These toys are available at most toy stores. All you will need to do is place the bugs in the tray and then fill it with water. Once the tray is frozen you'll have bugs in the ice!

The Cake: Be Innovative with your Decoration!

- ✚ Hide little jewels inside the cake before it is frosted.
- ✚ How about making a skull and cross bones on front? Great idea! Use frosting for this job.
- ✚ Use fish or pirate items to design the sides of your cake.
- ✚ Give the effect of the ocean by decorating a rectangular cake with wavy blue butter cream. Create an island out of an upside down muffin cake and use green icing to enhance the illusion.
- ✚ Decorate your cake with toy pirate ships set atop a sea of blue icing.
- ✚ Make a cake that simulates a pirate ship. Give it a name and decorate it with little hooks and pirate items.
- ✚ Crush up graham crackers to use as sand.
- ✚ Get candies that look like beer barrels and coins.

More creative ideas

- ✚ Describe all your food items with interesting pirate names.
- ✚ Try to serve seafood if possible.
- ✚ Avoid any kind of table ware as far as possible. Let your guests use their hands and fingers to eat.
- ✚ Serve up gold fish crackers as a snack.
- ✚ Serve coconuts as "cannonballs."

- ✚ Serve various types of tropical fruits to give your guest the sense that they are feasting at a tropical island. Mangos, bananas, and the like will all work well.
- ✚ Use pales and buckets instead of bowls.
- ✚ Use disposable glasses with a skull and crossbones design. The cups are easily available or you can have them made at order.

Make Money while Having Fun at your Pirate Party

One great excuse for a party is to host a fund raising event. Try inviting vendors and allow them to sell their items and wears. Don't forget about the entertainers, who can keep the party moving along while asking for tips. It would be even better to have your entertainers come dressed as pirates! If you don't want to hire an entertainer, ask one of your friends to play the role. You can also have various characters wandering the party. Drunken pirates and dancing ladies will all have a positive impact on the party. They will help ensure that your guests remain entertained.

Another interesting idea for a fundraiser would be to arrest your guests! If you create a jail cell, like the one described earlier, you can use it to imprison your guests. Appoint a "Spanish Lieutenant" to make the arrests. For a few dollars, guests can instruct the Lieutenant to arrest any of the guests they wish. The prisoner will either have to spend 10 minutes in jail, or spend a few dollars to make bail. This will entertain your guests throughout the party because no one will be certain who will be the next to be arrested. You can even make up bogus charges like mutiny or treason.
